
Guide to Pick-Your-Own Farms

The Delaware Valley is rich in farm-fresh crops. Here's a guide to family fruit and veggie picking at farms near you.

You can stock up on produce (kids love to help) and, at many sites, take part in activities such as hayrides and harvest festivals.

To prepare for a day of picking in the fields, apply sunscreen, wear a hat and pack a picnic lunch. At larger farms arrange for a meeting spot in case someone gets lost.

Crops in the chart that follows are listed according to approximate harvest date. Always call ahead to learn crop availability and which varieties are offered.
